

Staying Overnight at Fair? Register Today!

The Facts on Fair!

1. 4-H Adults & Youth Staying Overnight —Get your Registration Forms In (Enclosed in this mailing!)

All adults present, including paid 4-H staff, appointed 4-H volunteers, and other adults, staying overnight at the Fair must complete the New Jersey 4-H Event Release/Agreement Form for Adults **prior to attending the Fair.**

NJ 4-H Event Permission Form for Youth (for daily participation and off-site field trip) must be completed for all 4-H member attendees staying overnight at the Fair.

New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct

The primary purpose of the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct is to ensure the safety and well-being of all participants at 4-H sponsored events and activities. It applies to all participants, with participants defined as 4-H members, their parents/guardians, and volunteers.

As a participant in the 4-H program, I will:

- Conduct myself in a courteous manner and treat members, parents, 4-H volunteers, Extension staff, judges and others with respect. Appropriate language and behavior are expected at all times.
- Respect and adhere to the rules and guidelines of the 4-H program including all those specific to a 4-H event or activity.
- Uphold an individual's right to dignity by supporting an environment of inclusion which welcomes involvement of participants from all backgrounds.
- Accept supervision and support from county and state 4-H staff while participating in the 4-H program. This includes acceptance of supervision and support from appointed 4-H volunteers coordinating 4-H events and activities.
- Obey local, state and federal laws.
- All aspects of the 4-H Code of Conduct and Discipline Policy apply to your social media presence involving 4-H.

Participants who fail to adhere to the New Jersey 4-H Code of Conduct are subject to a range of disciplinary actions. Such actions will be taken in compliance with the New Jersey 4-H Discipline Policy and Procedure. When appropriate, immediate corrective action will be taken at the 4-H event to ensure the safety and welfare of all participants.

I understand if I fail to adhere to the above Code of Conduct, I will be subject to disciplinary action and potentially prohibited from attending and participating in the New Jersey 4-H Youth Development program.

RULES: NO HORSE WILL LEAVE THE FAIRGROUNDS UNTIL

SUNDAY MORNING

<u>Trailer Area</u>

- 1. Pre-register with the 4-H Center to bring in a trailer. All trailers must be in place by 6 PM Sunday. Fee: \$65 for the week. Electric and water available.
- 2. A Parent/Authorized Adult/Leader must stay in trailer when members stay overnight in trailer. All Adults staying overnight must complete the NJ 4-H Event Release/Agreement Form for Adults.
- 3. Curfew governing horse area: Members staying overnight must be back in the area by 11 PM. All visitors must leave the area by 11:30 PM. This also applies to the trailer area.
- 4. If there is a special event on Friday night conflicting with the 11 PM curfew, the members must be accompanied by a leader or parent and must obtain special permission to attend from the horse area superintendent.
- 5. Only 4-H members, Parents, Leaders & Authorized Adults may stay overnight in the horse or trailer area. **All Adults** must complete the NJ 4-H Event Release/Agreement Form for Adults & **All Youth** must complete NJ 4-H Event Permission for Youth.
- 6. <u>NO ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES</u> allowed on Fairgrounds. This is a State 4-H and Cumberland County Fair Association rule. Don't jeopardize your trailer privilege.

Barn Area

- 1. All members staying overnight in the barn area must remain in the designated area.
- 2. Each member is responsible for always keeping his stall and barn area clean.
- 3. Anyone using the wash rack must clean up manure.
- 4. All riders must lead their horses from and to the barn area at the racetrack end of the barns.
- 5. You will respect the property of others. No borrowing without the owner's permission.
- 6. No water fights will be permitted!
- 7. No riding in ring after 10 PM without permission!

General Rules

- 1. 4-H Members must complete the NJ 4-H Event Permission Form for Youth.
- 2. General Curfew: 11 PM. All 4-H horse club members staying overnight must be back in the barn area by 11 PM.
- 3. Each club staying overnight must have an Authorized Adult or Leader staying with them.
- 4. Visitors must leave the area by 11:30 PM. *NOTICE:* Members not stabling a horse are asked to use the front gate if visiting Fairgrounds at night, due to the 11 PM curfew of barn and trailer areas; you must exit via the front gate, also.
- 5. <u>All rules must be obeyed by members and parents</u>. Any infraction of rules will be cause for immediate dismissal from grounds of member, horse, camper, and family.
- 6. Riders must be at least 5 years old (exception: Pony Lead Line.).
- 7. 4-H members must take care of their animal with reasonable assistance from parent and/or leader. However, your project animal represents the Cumberland County 4-H Program and must be always clean and well-cared for.

COMMENT:

Staying overnight is a privilege, not mandatory. There should be a designated person responsible for each club's stable area each night.
